

From the desk

of the Chainperson



I trust that the year is treating you well so far.

Time truly flies, and we must not take a single day for granted. The previous year was challenging for both the Estate and the greater Kathu area, particularly on the economic front.

The economy is in a difficult position due to declining growth in our country, coupled with the mining industry going through a tough period. However, we remain hopeful for this year! We have already noticed signs of improvement in the market as the year has started on a more positive note.

Additionally, we encountered some unforeseen challenges with dolomite in our area. The developers are assisting us by drilling four boreholes to gather the detailed information required by the Geotechnical Department and the NHBRC. We can also report that the Estate has been declared a D2 area, meaning that building activities can proceed, provided that specific requirements are followed for NHBRC enrollment and construction.

Updates & Progress on the Estate:

- We anticipate that building activities will pick up shortly.
- You may have noticed that we have completed the paving of Teiken and Teleskoop Slot.
- Work has begun on modifications to the western gate, particularly regarding the contractor's gate operations in the future.
- Unfortunately, we experienced lightning damage at the western gate.
 The damaged components have been replaced, but our IT provider is
 facing challenges in ensuring full functionality due to incompatibilities
 between the older and newer generation systems. We trust this will be
 resolved soon.
- Dassie Park is progressing well. We are currently taking stock before
 moving on to the next phase, which may include adding a pickleball
 court, trampoline, swings, and more. However, our security project
 remains a top priority and will proceed as the budget allows.
- Due to the growing populations of both impala and springbok, we are planning the capture and relocation of some of the rams at the most suitable time.
- The 10-hectare area has been fenced off, and owners are welcome to use it for walking or running. The entrance gate is locked, and keys are available at the admin office for a small fee to cover costs.
- We are pleased to report no security concerns at this time and extend our gratitude to Rhino Security for their continued dedication.
- Our garden competition is currently underway, and the winners will be announced on March 26, 2025, during a function on the grass at Dassie Park.
- You may have also noticed that the old speed control measures have been replaced with speed bumps. We are already seeing a positive impact on speed adherence.



Discover the Feathered

Friends of Our Gardens

Our estate is a haven for a variety of captivating bird species. With a little effort, you can attract these beautiful birds to your garden and enjoy their presence year-round. Here's a closer look at some of our regular avian visitors, their diets, and how to invite them into your space.



Southern Yellow-billed Hornbill (Tockus leucomelas) – Geelbekneushoringvoël

<u>Description:</u> Also called the "flying banana" due to its large, curved yellow bill, this charismatic bird has black-and-white plumage and a comical hopping gait.

<u>Diet:</u> Insects, small reptiles, seeds, and fruit. Attracting Them: Plant indigenous fruit-bearing trees and shrubs. Keeping a natural garden with mulch and leaf litter will encourage insects, which hornbills love to forage for.



2. Swallow-tailed Bee-eater (Merops hirundineus) – Swaelstertbyvreter

<u>Description:</u> A dazzling green bird with a golden throat and a long forked blue tail. Its aerial acrobatics while hunting insects are a sight to behold!

<u>Diet:</u> Bees, wasps, and other flying insects. Attracting Them: Avoid pesticides to maintain a healthy insect population. Open spaces with a few high perches (like a dead tree or fence posts) make perfect hunting grounds.



3. Red-breasted Shrike (Laniarius atrococcineus) – Rooiborslaksman

<u>Description:</u> A striking bird with a deep red chest, black upperparts, and a white wing patch. Often heard before it is seen, with its beautiful whistling call.

<u>Diet:</u> Insects, spiders, and small reptiles. Attracting Them: Shrikes prefer gardens with thorny bushes and dense vegetation where they can hunt and impale their prey on sharp branches.



4. Groundscraper Thrush (Turdus litsitsirupa) – Gevlekte Lyster

<u>Description:</u> A bold and confident thrush with spotted underparts and a distinctive bobbing walk.

<u>Diet:</u> Insects, worms, small fruits, and seeds.
Attracting Them: These birds love short grass and open lawns where they can hunt for insects. They'll also appreciate a bird bath to drink and cool off.



5. Verreaux's Eagle-Owl (Bubo lacteus) – Reuse-ooruil

<u>Description:</u> The largest owl in Africa, with powerful talons, fluffy ear tufts, and striking pink eyelids. A pair of these magnificent birds has made their home on the golf course.

<u>Diet:</u> Small mammals, birds, reptiles, and even hedgehogs.

Attracting Them: Owls need tall trees for roosting. If you're lucky, you may spot them at dusk as they start hunting. Keeping artificial lights to a minimum will help nocturnal birds thrive.

HOW TO ATTRACT MORE BIRDS TO YOUR GARDEN

Plant Indigenous Trees & Shrubs: Indigenous plants provide natural food sources like berries and insects. Provide Water: A birdbath or shallow water dish can attract thirsty birds, especially in the dry months.

Limit Pesticide Use: Healthy insect populations ensure a steady food source for birds.


Create Safe Spaces: Dense bushes and trees provide shelter and nesting spots.

Authentic Hungarian Goulash Heart Warming Recipe

A thoroughly authentic Hungarian Goulash with a richness of flavor that will satisfy both body and soul!

INGREDIENTS:

3 tablespoons butter

680 g yellow onions chopped

27 g quality genuine imported Hungarian sweet paprika

680 g stewing beef, cut into pieces

5 cloves garlic, minced

2 red bell peppers, seeded/membranes removed, cut into chunks

1 yellow bell pepper, seeded/membranes removed, cut into chunks

2 tomatoes, diced

2 carrots, diced

2 medium potatoes, cut into chunks

1200 ml beef broth (traditionally just water is used but beef broth adds so much more flavor)

1 bay leaf

1 teaspoon salt

0.5 teaspoon freshly ground black pepper

0.5 teaspoon crushed caraway seeds (optional, not traditional in all regions)

Melt the butter in a Dutch oven or other heavy soup pot over medium high heat and cook the onions until beginning to brown, about 7-10 minutes. Add the beef and cook until the beef is just starting to brown, 7-10 minutes.

Add the bell peppers, tomatoes, and garlic and cook for another 6-8 minutes. (Note about peppers: Outside of Hungary it's very difficult to find the peppers they use there. The best ones to use in their place are red and some yellow/orange. Avoid regular green bell peppers as they have a starkly different flavor profile.)

Remove the pot from the heat and stir in the paprika, salt, pepper and caraway (if using) (note: paprika becomes bitter if at all scorched).

Add the beef broth, bay leaf, return to the stove and bring to a boil. Reduce the heat to medium, cover and simmer for 40 minutes. Add the carrots, tomatoes and potatoes. Return to a boil, reduce the heat to medium, cover, and simmer for another 30-40 minutes or until the beef is nice and tender. Add salt to taste. Remove the bay leaf.

Serve with some crusty bread and, if desired, a dollop of sour cream.

Meet Kathu's Common Snakes: Our Slithering Co-Residents

Living in Kathu, Northern Cape, means sharing our beautiful environment with a variety of wildlife, including some fascinating snakes. Understanding these creatures can help us appreciate them and coexist safely. Here are five snakes commonly found in our area:



1. Cape Cobra (Naja nivea)

<u>Description:</u> The Cape Cobra is a highly venomous snake measuring between 1.2 to 1.4 meters in length. Its coloration varies widely, including shades of yellow, brown, and black.

Habitat: This species is prevalent throughout the Northern Cape, inhabiting arid savannas, fynbos, bushveld, deserts, and semi-desert regions.

Venom: Highly venomous; bites require immediate medical attention.



2. Puff Adder (Bitis arietans)

Description: A stout-bodied snake averaging 1 to 1.5 meters in length, the Puff Adder has a distinctive chevron pattern along its back, varying in color from yellow to brown.

Habitat: Widespread across sub-Saharan Africa, including the Northern Cape, it favors savannas, grasslands, and open woodlands.

Venom: Highly venomous; bites can cause severe pain and require immediate medical attention.



3. Boomslang (Dispholidus typus)

<u>Description:</u> A slender, arboreal snake reaching up to 1.8 meters in length. Males are typically bright green, while females are brown or grey.

Habitat: Found in various habitats, including savannas and forests, the Boomslang is present in the Northern Cape.

Venom: Highly venomous; however, bites to humans are rare due to the snake's reclusive nature.



4. Brown House Snake (Boaedon capensis)

Description: A non-venomous snake measuring between 60 to 120 centimeters. It has a brown body with lighter stripes running along its length.

Habitat: Common in urban and rural areas, including the Northern Cape, it often resides in homes and gardens, feeding on rodents.

Venom: Non-venomous.



5. Western Tiger Snake (Telescopus polystictus)

Description: A colorful nocturnal snake that is orangepink to salmon pink above with 52–75 dark blotches on the body and tail. It typically measures around 60 centimeters in length.

Habitat: Inhabits rocky areas or hides under the bark of trees in the Northern Cape region.

Venom: Mildly venomous; poses little threat to humans.

TIPS FOR ENCOUNTERING SNAKES

Stay Calm: If you encounter a snake, remain calm and avoid sudden movements. Most snakes are nonaggressive and will retreat if given the opportunity.

Keep Distance: Maintain a safe distance and do not attempt to handle or provoke the snake.

Try to take a picture for identification and send a whatsapp to the security group to assist with removal. Keep an eye on the snake if you can, from a safe distance.

DETERRING SNAKES FROM YOUR HOME

Eliminate Hiding Spots: Clear away piles of debris, wood, and tall grass where snakes may hide.

Secure Entrances: Seal cracks and gaps in your home's foundation, walls, and doors to prevent snakes from entering.

Use Plants: Some plants naturally repel snakes, including Lavender, Marigolds, Rosemary, Onion & Garlic plants and Lemongrass.

By understanding and respecting these remarkable reptiles, we can safely share our environment with them.
